Great Gravity Experiments for Kids Galileo and Gravity. Galileo was a famous scientist in the 16th and 17th Century. His most famous observation was that two objects of the same size but slightly different mass (how much "stuff" it is made of) hit the ground at the same time, as far as he could tell, if they are dropped from the same height.

Galileo Galilei (1564 - 1642) observes Mars with a primitive telescope, becoming the first person to use it for astronomical purposes. 1659 The Dutch astronomer Christiaan Huygens (1629 - 1695) draws Mars using an advanced telescope of his own design. He records a large, dark spot on Mars, probably Syrtis Major.

1600s - NASA Mars
During its 58-minute life, the probe penetrated 124 miles (200 kilometers) into Jupiter's violent atmosphere before it was crushed, melted and/or vaporized by the intense pressure and temperature. Galileo data allowed the creation of the first detailed maps of Jupiter's major moons.
